We recognise your struggle, your strength, your persistence and your love.


Some of us grew up knowing the stories of how this sector began; others are still learning.

But we also know what we need to stay safe, strong and connected for the long haul. We want solidarity and opportunities to connect with our peers.

We want time and space, supported by leadership, to learn and grow through things like cross-service secondments, mentoring, and professional development.



We need real investment in self-care and wellbeing, and work environments that not only respect but *embrace* these needs with proactive cultural supervision, clear boundaries, and structures that reduce the expectation of client contact after hours.

Working in this sector is how we care for our community.

We don't want to repeat that cycle. We want to honour your legacy by changing the conditions that make this work unsustainable.

Because this job takes a lot out of us and if nothing changes, we risk becoming part of the very problem we're here to solve. If our organisations can't keep *us* safe, how can we keep our clients and communities safe?
